



Fact Sheet 6—International movement record

An international movement record is a document that details your Australian arrival and departure records for a requested timeframe. We can provide you with your arrival and departure records to and from Australia dating from 1981.

How to apply

To apply for your international movement record download form 1359 *Request for international movement records* from our website immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/form-listing/forms/1359.pdf

Scan and email your completed form and supporting documents to request.movement@homeaffairs.gov.au

Processing time

Requests will take approximately one month.

Proof of identity

Requests must include a scanned colour copy of your current photographic identification, such as a passport or driver's licence. If a black and white copy is provided, it must be a certified copy. Applications without photo ID will not be processed.

For information on who can certify a copy of a document, please refer to page 1 of the application form instructions.

Requesting records for children under 18

If you are requesting records for your child under the age of 18, you must provide a certified copy of the birth certificate for the child in addition to proof of your identity.

Receiving your records

You will receive an email with a PDF attachment showing your movements for the requested period. If no record is found, you will receive an email stating this.

Visa entitlement verification online (VEVO)
